## **Background**

Following the completion of our Young Leaders of Learning (YLLs) program in session 2022/23, our Leaders of Learning (LOLs) graduated to Leaders of Change (LOCs). Last session, our LOCs received training through our Community Learning and Development (CLD) partners to become Learning Ambassadors.

Our Period of Change last session focussed on what an effective lesson looks like within Williamwood and the creation of our Learner Principles based on PROACTIVE.

CLD delivered training where our LOCs engaged with HgiOURS under the theme of 'Our Learning & Teaching' on how to identify areas of effective practice within a lesson through the Learning Ambassador programme through Education Scotland.

This session, our LOCs will begin 'Pupil Pop-ins'.

## **What is a Pupil Pop-in?**

A Pupil Pop-in will see 2 leaders coming into a classroom for a maximum of 15 minutes.

Within their time in the class, the leaders will be looking at a specific aspect of the classroom environment in line with PROACTIVE. During their time in the class, the leaders will look for excellent experiences to allow them to highlight and identify the impact this has on the Learning, Teaching & Assessment within the classroom environment.

Through their training with CLD, our leaders produced a Code of Conduct alongside a Learning Visit Proforma which they will use to collate information from their Pop-in.

Leaders will then identify the excellent experiences across the school and feedback to the whole school staff.



## Code of Conduct

- Good timekeeping: Arrive at the beginning of lesson and remain in the classroom for a maximum of 15 minutes.
- Be prepared – make sure you have all the resources/equipment you need.
- Do not have any preconceived ideas about lessons; feedback should be based on your observations only
- Be respectful: Stay quiet during the lesson and do not distract pupils
- Stay focussed: take thorough notes; listen
- Remember to take a view of everything that is going on
- Don't share your findings with others; your notes should be confidential
- Reflect on the lesson with your peers (only members of Leaders Change or Young Leaders of Learning)
